

## RE: Fáilte ar ais

The BoM and School Staff are looking forward to welcoming all our pupils back to school for the 2020/2021 school year on Monday next, 31<sup>st</sup> August/Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> September.

We are satisfied that we have control measures in place to ensure that this will be a safe re-opening. It will take some time for all of us to get used to the "new circumstances" as we become familiar with the new routines and procedures designed to keep everyone safe and to prevent the spread of the virus. There will, undoubtedly, be some unforeseen challenges and we will deal with these as they arise.

The following changes will be in place:

- Children are to wear their school uniform on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. On Tuesday
  and Thursday, we ask that they wear appropriate clothes suitable for school activities. This
  will allow for the washing and drying of uniforms.
- Children are asked to only bring their lunch and a drink bottle with them to school. No school bags permitted.
- Children are asked to bring a pencil case which will be left in school. It may include pencil/pens, rubber, sharpener, ruler, colours e.g. twistables.
- Children must bring a waterproof coat to school each day regardless of the weather.
- Warm water is now available throughout the school and children will wash their hands/sanitise regularly throughout the day. There are 28 sanitising units available to children/staff.
- A one-way system will be in operation on both the school grounds and indoors.
- Children will be met at the school gates by a member of staff in the morning.
- Each bubble (classroom) will enter and exit the school through their external classroom door.
- Each bubble will play in designated play areas.
- Children from 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> class will sit and be encouraged to stay 1m apart.
